NEW BUSINESS - EDRLF fund

CDD Rux discussed the proposed Fairfield Inn development for a 79 room hotel, options for their SDC costs, estimated SDC costs, TLT revenue, and visitor spending. Staff's proposal was for \$70,000 to come from ARPA funding, \$394,000 to come from Fund 14 (repayment from TLT revenue to the General Fund back to Fund 14), and Fairfield Inn would pay the remaining balance. There was discussion regarding the structure of the loan fund and financing for other projects.

Charlie Harris, Newberg resident, did not think they should subsidize this project when the City had not given this much money towards affordable housing. Local builders thought the SDCs were too high, but they had not received any subsidy. He thought the City should offer installments to pay the SDCs like other developers had to do. Also they should be charging 6% to 6.5% interest rate for the Revolving Loan Fund as was the City's policy. He did not think this developer should be treated any differently than local developers.

Mike Gougler, Newberg resident, thought it was in Newberg's best interest to have a midgrade business hotel to help generate revenue for the City. He was in support of staff's recommendation.

There was discussion regarding the loan rate, other communities that had offered this type of incentive, funds left for other projects, and reasons for voting in favor.
