Subject: City Council Work Session – Fire/EMS Update

During the November 2, 2015 City Council Work Session, there will be a presentation on a potential option to the City for delivery of Fire/EMS.

As has been discussed over the last several years, due to limitations in the General Fund, there is great concern for the City's ability to sustain needed service levels in delivery of Fire/EMS. Staff has been researching potential service delivery model options to overcome this concern.

Recent growth with Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue (TVF&R) has presented a unique opportunity for both TVF&R and the City to consider a consolidation of Fire/EMS services.

Through a PowerPoint presentation, TVF&R Fire Chief Mike Duyck, TVF&R Deputy Chief Dustin Morrow, and I, along with staffs from both agencies, will discuss how such a consolidation would operate and provide higher levels of service at no additional cost.
