Population and Housing Narrative Profile: 2009-2011

2009-2011 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates

Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.


Households and Families

In 2009-2011 there were 7,500 households in Newberg city, Oregon. The average household size was 2.7 people.

Families made up 69 percent of the households in Newberg city, Oregon. This figure includes both married-couple families (51 percent) and other families (18 percent). Of other families, 5 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 31 percent of all households in Newberg city, Oregon. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Newberg city, Oregon, 38 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 24 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.

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Nativity and Foreign Born

Ninety-one percent of the people living in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011 were native residents of the United States. Forty-eight percent of these residents were living in the state in which they were born.

Ten percent of the people living in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011 were foreign born. Of the foreign born population, 31 percent were naturalized U.S. citizens, and 67 percent entered the country before the year 2000. Thirty-three percent of the foreign born entered the country in 2000 or later.

Foreign born residents of Newberg city, Oregon come from different parts of the world.



Geographic Mobility of Residents of Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011




Education

In 2009-2011, 25 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 28 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Fourteen percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Newberg city, Oregon was 6,700 in 2009-2011. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 690 and elementary or high school enrollment was 3,200 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 2,900.

Disability

In Newberg city, Oregon, among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in 2009-2011, 13 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 6 percent of people under 18 years old, to 11 percent of people 18 to 64 years old, and to 41 percent of those 65 and over.

Employment Status and Type of Employer


In Newberg city, Oregon, 61 percent of the population 16 and over were employed; 33 percent were not currently in the labor force.

Eighty-four percent of the people employed were private wage and salary workers; 10 percent were federal, state, or local government workers; and 6 percent were self-employed in their own (not incorporated) business.



Commuting to Work

Seventy- percent of Newberg city, Oregon workers drove to work alone in 2009-2011, and 15 percent carpooled. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 23 minutes to get to work.


Percent of Workers 16 and over Commuting by Mode in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011



Income


The median income of households in Newberg city, Oregon was \$53,426. Eleven percent of households had income below \$15,000 a year and 2 percent had income over \$150,000 or more.

Eighty-three percent of the households received earnings and 17 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-six percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$17,850. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.


Proportion of Households with Various Income Sources in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011



Poverty and Participation in Government Programs

In 2009-2011, 11 percent of people were in poverty. Thirteen percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 2 percent of people 65 years old and over. Eight percent of all families and 40 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

Poverty Rates in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011




Health Insurance

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011, 82 percent had health insurance coverage and 18 percent did not have health insurance coverage. For those under 18 years of age, 11 percent had no health insurance coverage. The civilian noninstitutionalized population had both private and public health insurance, with 70 percent having private coverage and 23 percent having public coverage.

Population

In 2009-2011, Newberg city, Oregon had a total population of 22,000 - 11,000 (51 percent) females and 11,000 (49 percent) males. The median age was 32.2 years. Twenty-four percent of the population was under 18 years and 12 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Newberg city, Oregon in 2009-2011




For people reporting one race alone, 91 percent were White; 1 percent were Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 2 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 6 percent were Some other race. Five percent reported Two or more races. Thirteen percent of the people in Newberg city, Oregon were Hispanic. Eighty- percent of the people in Newberg city, Oregon were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Housing Characteristics

In 2009-2011, Newberg city, Oregon had a total of 8,200 housing units, 8 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 66 percent were in single-unit structures, 23 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 11 percent were mobile homes. Forty-six percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

The median number of rooms in all housing units in Newberg city, Oregon is 5. Of these housing units, 67 percent have three or more bedrooms.

Occupied Housing Unit Characteristics

In 2009-2011, Newberg city, Oregon had 7,500 occupied housing units - 5,000 (67 percent) owner occupied and 2,500 (34 percent) renter occupied. Eighty-one percent of householders of these units had moved in since 2000. (X) percent of the owner occupied units had a mortgage. Two percent of the households did not have telephone service. Seven percent had no vehicles available and another 25 percent had three or more.



Housing Costs

The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,696, nonmortgaged owners \$481, and renters \$906. Forty-five percent of owners with mortgages, 14 percent of owners without mortgages, and 58 percent of renters in Newberg city, Oregon spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.

Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. The degree of uncertainty for an estimate arising from sampling variability is represented through the use of a margin of error. The value shown here is the 90 percent margin of error. The margin of error can be interpreted roughly as providing a 90 percent probability that the interval defined by the estimate minus the margin of error and the estimate plus the margin of error (the lower and upper confidence bounds) contains the true value. In addition to sampling variability, the ACS estimates are subject to nonsampling error (for a discussion of nonsampling variability, see Accuracy of the Data). The effect of nonsampling error is not represented in these tables.

Starting in 2008, the Scotch-Irish category does not include Irish-Scotch. People who reported Irish-Scotch ancestry are classified under "Other groups," whereas in 2007 and earlier they were classified as Scotch-Irish.

The Census Bureau introduced a new set of disability questions in the 2008 ACS questionnaire. Accordingly, comparisons of disability data from 2008 or later with data from prior years are not recommended. For more information on these questions and their evaluation in the 2006 ACS Content Test, see the Evaluation Report Covering Disability.

While the 2009-2011 American Community Survey (ACS) data generally reflect the December 2009 Office of Management and Budget (OMB) definitions of metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas; in certain instances the names, codes, and boundaries of the principal cities shown in ACS tables may differ from the OMB definitions due to differences in the effective dates of the geographic entities.

Estimates of urban and rural population, housing units, and characteristics reflect boundaries of urban areas defined based on Census 2000 data. Boundaries for urban areas have not been updated since Census 2000. As a result, data for urban and rural areas from the ACS do not necessarily reflect the results of ongoing urbanization.
