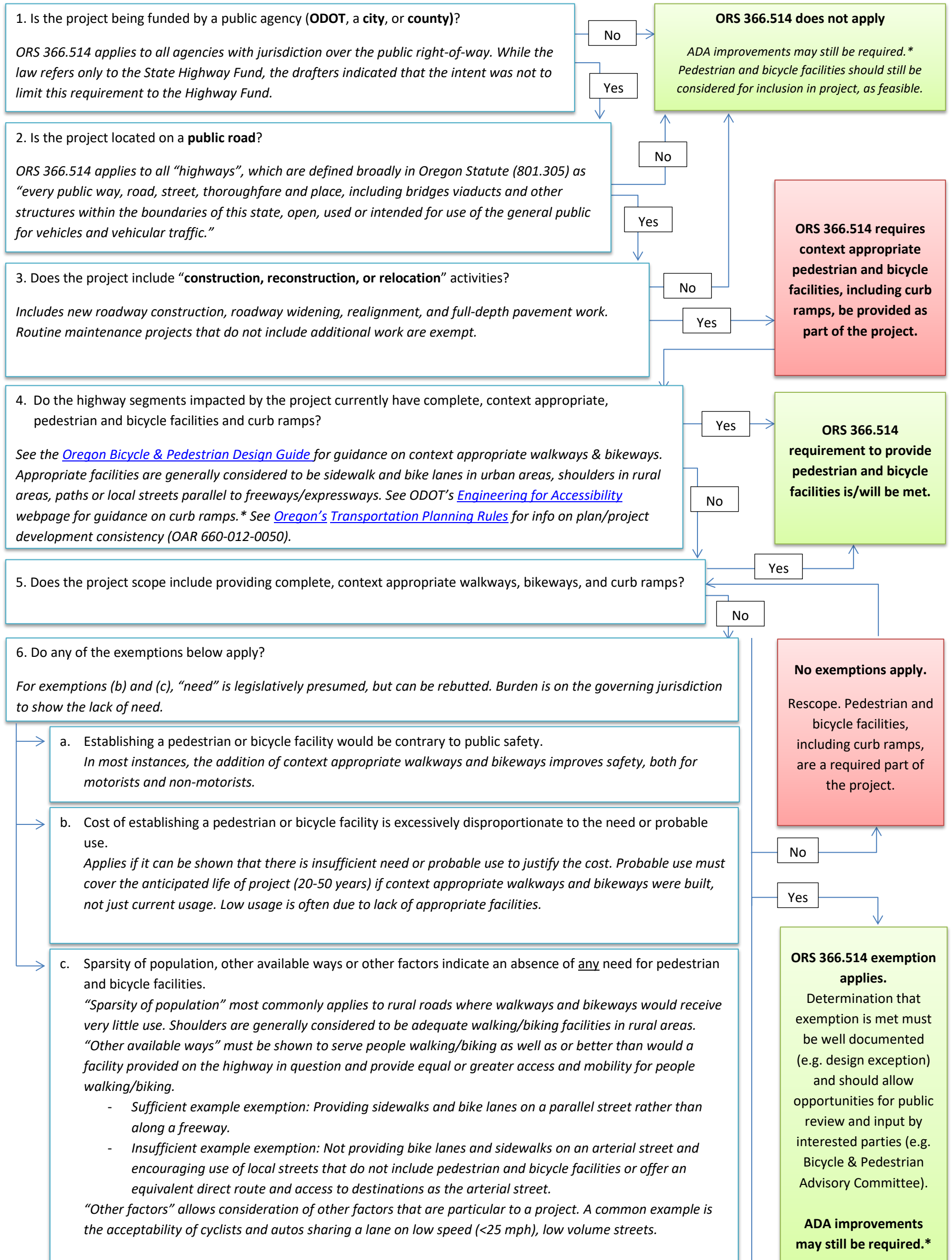


Oregon Pedestrian and Bicycle Bill (ORS 366.514) Screening Process

The "Pedestrian and Bicycle Bill" (ORS 366.514) was enacted in 1971 to ensure Oregon roadways provide facilities that allow for safe travel by people walking and biking. The law establishes when pedestrian and bicycle facilities must be provided as part of transportation projects. The law applies to all transportation projects in the state, regardless of who owns the facility, project funding source, or amount. The flow chart below is intended to help determine if a project triggers ORS 366.514 requirements and if any exemptions apply. Exemptions must be well documented. *Note: Federal requirements for when Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements must be provided as part of highway projects are separate from the ORS 366.514 requirement to provide pedestrian and bicycle facilities.
