Aiden is notorious for not being able to guess the endings of books and movies and organizes their bookshelves by color.


Their books for teens are "Cemetery Boys" published in 2020 and "Lost in the Never Woods" published in 2021. Pronouns: he/him and they/them.

New Items to the library


During our closure, we have added some new things to our collection.


