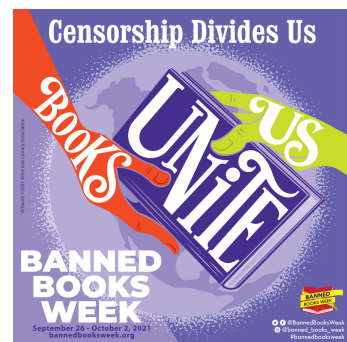

Library staff will continue offering the following services Tuesday-Saturday, 12-6 p.m.:

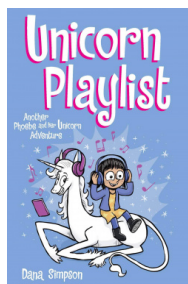

## Curbside Pick-up

Curbside in three easy steps:

1. Place your items on hold using the CCRLS app or through the catalog OR request a personalized Book Bundle at (503) 538-7323; option 4 or [www.newberglibrary.org](http://www.newberglibrary.org).
2. When you receive the hold arrival text or email: Call us at (503) 538-7323, ext. 6. **Please have your library card ready.** We will ask for it. Give us 30 minutes after you speak with a staff member before coming to pick up your items. You may need to wait for us to return your call at busy times.
3. Pull up in a curbside spot in front of the library and **call the number on the orange cone** to let staff know that you have arrived. Staff will deliver items to your trunk.

3. Estacione en un lugar en la acera al frente, **llame al número en el cono naranja** y deje saber al personal que ha llegado. El personal entregará los materiales a su cajuela.
