I am an audiobook enthusiast. Last week when my husband and I purchased a new-to-us car, I just couldn't get over how amazing it was to plug my phone into the car and listen to the story through the speakers. Best. Car. Ever.

I have always loved to listen to stories read out loud, even - or maybe especially - when I was a young struggling reader with an undiagnosed vision problem who didn't like reading. I remember coloring at my desk

in 2nd grade listening to Mrs. (Sally) Howard read *Little Witch* by Anna Elizabeth Bennett to the class at Central Elementary School (now Chehalem Cultural Center). I remember doodling in middle school as Mrs. (Diane) Allen read us *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee, at Springbrook Middle School (now Mountain View Middle School). And I remember Mrs. (Polly) Peterson reading aloud poetry during my freshman year of high school while she gestured broadly with her hands, keeping us all entertained.

I still love being read to. While sometimes I listen to my husband as he reads the *Lord of the Rings* trilogy by JRR Tolkien to our kids (masterfully doing all the voices), most of the time it's audiobooks I've downloaded from the library's Libby, by Overdrive app.

I listen while I drive, while I work-out, while I do yard work, when I fold laundry, or do any of the not-so-glamorous household chores I don't really enjoy. I even listened to Terry Pratchett's *Wee Free Men* in the early stages of labor with my son and JK Rowling's *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone* during dental surgery. I am soothed by stories I know well, and I'm endlessly curious about the stories I haven't heard yet. What are you listening to lately?

Did you know that in addition to audio CDs, the library offers Playaways, pre-loaded audiobooks that give you the portability and freedom to take audiobooks everywhere? You can also download ebooks and audiobooks with your Newberg Public Library card using Libby by Overdrive.






