Hello Friends,

It's time once again for the Summer Reading Program!

As June begins, our children's librarians are visiting, in-person or virtually, public and private elementary schools in Newberg, Dundee, and St. Paul to promote our upcoming Summer Reading Programs. Children's librarians have also visited each Head Start classroom in Newberg. In addition to this, over 250 students are visiting the library in the next few weeks on library tours!



The Newberg Public Library's Summer Reading Program is available for all ages-- babies, preschoolers, elementary students, teens, and adults are all welcome to participate. Summer Reading begins June 4th and continues through August 13th, 2022. I invite you to join us at the library to see what all the fun is about!

In the Summer Reading Program, every baby to fifth grader receives a free book of their choosing when they come to the library to register for Summer Reading. Our library program is designed to keep up the reading habit for students so they avoid the *Summer Slide*, the loss of academic skills when kids are not regularly attending school, largely due to a lack of reading. For babies to preschoolers our program works to build *Early Literacy Skills*, the foundational skills children need before they learn to read and write in school. Teens will have a game board and will roll the dice to see what their next reading activity will be, which is a great way to keep teens engaged in the program. Adults participating in our program find a fun way to track reading and an easy-to-accomplish (we know time is limited) reading program. When youth see adults reading they understand the importance and are more likely to read themselves.

The Newberg Public Library's Summer Reading Program is funded by Oregon's Ready to Read grant, administered by the State Library of Oregon, the Newberg Library Foundation, and the Newberg Library Friends.

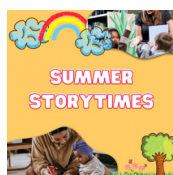

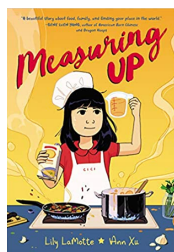
