

For the youngest among us: Board books, picture books, and also chapter

books by Newbery-winner Grace Lin (Taiwanese American). Other recent favorites include: "Dad Bakes," by Katie Yamasaki (Japanese American), "Watercress," by Andrea Wang (Chinese American), and "Under My Hijab," by Hena Khan (Pakastani American).

Middle-grade: "Prairie Lotus," by Linda Sue Park (Korean American), "Amal Unbound," by Aisha Saeed (Pakastani American), the "Front Desk" series by Kelly Yang (Chinese American), and "When You Trap a Tiger," by Tae Keller (Korean American) which won the 2021 Newbery medal and Asian American Pacific Islander Award.

Older teens: "Ember in the Ashes" series by Sabaa Tahir (Pakastani American) for an action-packed, hard-hitting fantasy series. For something completely different, a queer historical look at 1954's San Francisco: "Last Night at the Telegraph Club," winner of several major awards, by Malinda Lo (Chinese American). Need a family saga? Don't miss "You Bring the Distant Near," by Matali Perkins (Indian American).

Adults: For some great Korean American memoirs check out "All You Can Ever Know," by Nicole Chung, "Crying in H Mart," by Michelle Zauner, and "Minor Feelings: An Asian American Reckoning," by Cathy Park Hong. If you are a graphic novel fan check out this memoir as well: "The Best We Could Do," by Thi Bui (Vietnamese American). Looking for romance? Don't miss these steamy titles: "The Rajas," series by Sonali Dev (Indian American) and everything by author Helen Hoang (Vietnamese American). Looking for a mystery? Check out "The Verifiers," by Jane Pek (Singaporean American) for a technological murder mystery with a lesbian detective.
