Hello friends,

I have some exciting news, and also an ask for help. We are so fortunate to have a beautiful library - an original Carnegie Library built in 1912 with funds donated by Andrew Carnegie. With our historic library comes the need for repairs. If you have been in the historic portion of the library and looked closely at the windows, you will have seen the need for repairs to the original 1912 windows and doors.



It's important to me, and to the City of Newberg, that our

library be preserved in the best way possible. This will be done with restoration and repair to the wood and, likely, a slim insulating pane overlaying most of the current glass. The cost for this project is estimated at \$30,000. Thanks to the Newberg Library Friends, and your generous donations to the Newberg Library Friends, we have \$26,000 set aside for this project.

My ask to you is this, "will you help your library with the remaining \$4,000?" The Newberg Library Friends is a 501c3, so donations are tax-deductible. Any donations made to the Newberg Library Friends are given in full to the Newberg Public Library. If funds given exceed the amount needed for the windows, we would put the funds toward repairs for the cement work needed around the outside of the building with priority given to the cement work on the outside of the historic Carnegie building. We are so close to making this happen, and with your help we will get there!
