

A Note from Korie

Hello friends,

I am delighted to bring you some truly amazing news: If you live in Dundee or rural Newberg (all ages, including adults) you may now get a *Basic* library card free of charge. Everyone living within the Newberg city limits will still have access to a full-service library card, and a full-service library card will still be available for purchase for those outside Newberg city limits.



Thanks to former Library Director Will Worthey (now City Manager), with support from former Library Board member and Dundee resident, Rebecka Ratcliffe, and the support of the State Library of Oregon, an agreement was reached with the Polk, Yamhill, and Marion County library directors and the Chemeketa Cooperative Regional Library Service board to allow Dundee and rural residents access to a *Basic* library card. This comes at no cost to the City of Newberg. Other cities who access library services with *Basic* library cards include Lafayette, Carlton, and St. Paul.

That's the important news. If you would like to know how Dundee and rural Newberg came to be in the "library desert," one of just a few in Oregon, read on: In the 1970's, with a state vote, a group of libraries within Polk, Yamhill and Marion counties formed a library system with Chemeketa Cooperative Regional Library Services (CCRLS). Expenses for the cooperative (courier service, library operating system, some technology, etc.) are covered by Chemeketa Community College taxes, which Newberg (including rural) and Dundee do not pay since this area voted to pay taxes to Portland Community College in the 1960's, before Chemeketa Community College existed. Each library in the CCRLS system is funded by city, tribal, or library district taxes. The City of Newberg pays into CCRLS each year for residents to have full access to the entire library system. Meanwhile this has left Dundee and rural Newberg without library services.

Now, with the support of CCRLS and the State Library of Oregon, Dundee and rural Newberg have the option of a *Basic* library card. For around 50 years this lack of library service has prevented those on fixed incomes, families, and others, from accessing library materials. In the coming years, we hope to expand library service more, finding a solution with Dundee to bring full-service library cards to all residents. We see this as the first (giant) step in offering excellent customer service to those in Dundee and rural Newberg and a move toward a more permanent solution.

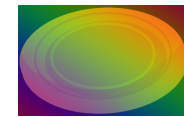

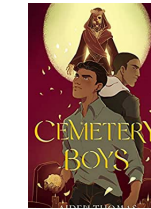

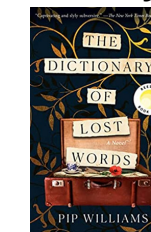
