Director's Note

Dear Friends.

I have an update for you on the repairs to the windows and doors of the 1912 Carnegie portion of the library. Last month the bid was updated after extensive rotting was found in the doors and windows facing south - the original front of the building seen in the drawing. The estimate is currently \$55,662.



Thanks to your generous donations and generous donations from our Newberg Library Friends, we are able to start the project even as we continue to raise funds for the full restoration. The two largest windows will be pulled out for restoration/replication, and an additional tempered pane will be added to the original glass, creating a double-paned window to help with noise, energy efficiency, and to protect the glazing. Additional panes of glass will be added to all of the original 1912 windows, helping with energy efficiency as well.

Your continued support to restore the Carnegie Library and keep it as a treasured Newberg building is inspiring. We are incredibly grateful for the funds we have received and are working hard to bring this project to a close. I will continue to keep you posted on our progress and when we expect the repairs to start at the library. There will be noise and shuffling of books for a short time as we make room for the work to be done!

- On May 26, 1908, the first librarian loaned the first book to the first patron to come through the door of the first public library in Newberg.
- Construction of the original 4,000 sq. ft. building was completed in 1912 for just \$10,000.
- Newberg Public Library has been in the heart of our community for over a hundred years--through two world wars, the Great Depression, civil rights, the computer revolution and much more.
