I adore Fall. What a beautiful part of the country we live in, and to me, it shines brightest in October. Are you a reader who likes books in season? I love books that get me in the mood for Autumn. So here, in no particular order, are my favorite mostly-not-too-scary Fall reads:

Anne of Green Gables, by L.M. Montgomery (1908)

Set on Prince Edward Island in the 1870's, an orphaned girl brings her brilliant self to a new family and town where she transforms the lives of everyone around her. The entire series is not to be missed!

• A Psalm for the Wild-Built, by Becky Chambers (2021)

Robots gained self-awareness and left for the wilderness centuries ago. As a tea monk seeks meaning in the wild they stumble across a robot looking for the answer to "What do people need?" Don't miss the "Monk & Robot" series.

Pumpkin Heads (graphic novel), by Faith Erin Hicks and Rainbow Rowell (2019)

Two teens spend their last High School Halloween working in a Pumpkin Patch together where love is in the air.

• Parnassus on Wheels, by Christopher Morley (1917)

It's 1915 and thirty-nine-year-old Helen is tired of keeping house for her brother so she impulsively buys a horse-drawn bookmobile and sets out for adventure. Check out the sequel, The Haunted Bookshop.

• **Dread Nation**, by Justina Ireland (2018) Okay, this one is a little scary

When the dead began walking on the battlefield of Gettysburg it ended the Civil War. With a new threat to humanity, Jane has trained in etiquette and combat, but she wants a different kind of life. Sequel: Deathless Divide.

• The Graveyard Book, by Neil Gaiman (2008)

Winner of the Newbery Award for Children's Literature, Gaiman weaves a story of death, life, and the family we make in this thrilling adventure of a young boy growing up nurtured by ghosts. Check out the three-part graphic novel series too.

Cemetery Boys, by Aiden Thomas (2020)

Yadriel is determined to prove himself to his family as a brujo, especially when they won't accept his gender. But as Día de los Muertos gets closer, he may not be able to sort out the ghost of Julian and free the ghost of his cousin in time.


