This past May marked twenty two years for me at the Newberg Public Library and I am delighted to have the opportunity to serve the community in a new capacity.



I started at the library as an unpaid intern from George Fox University and soon started working at the library a few hours a week shelving books, calling people to let them know their library holds had arrived, and assisting at the Children's Desk.


