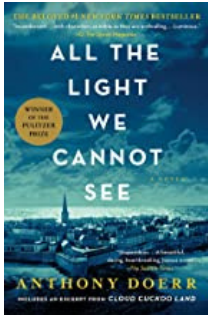

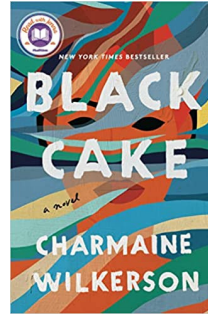


All the Light We Cannot See
