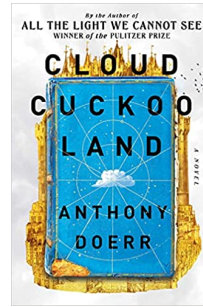


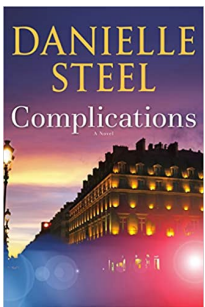
Beautiful World, Where Are You

Follows four young dreamers and outcasts through time and space, from 1453 Constantinople to the future, as they discover resourcefulness and hope amidst peril in this new novel.



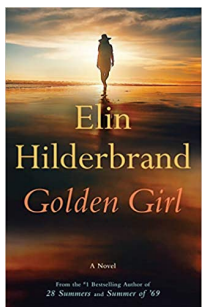
Complications

After four years of renovations and the death of its beloved manager, a popular Paris boutique hotel reopens with new staff looking to make good impressions but what they all find is unrelenting drama.



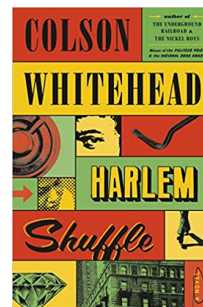
The Four Winds

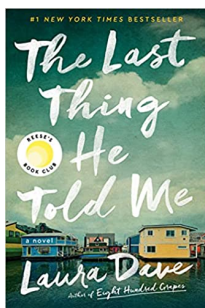
Island Queen

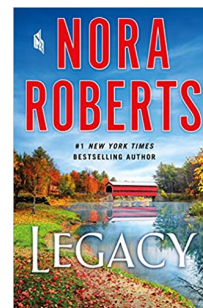
It's Better This Way

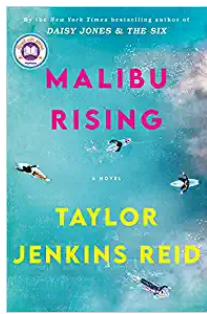
The Last Thing He Told Me

by Nora Roberts

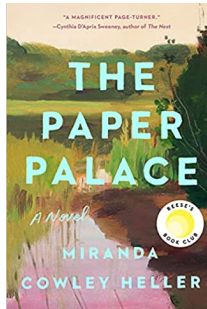

by Taylor Jenkins Reid

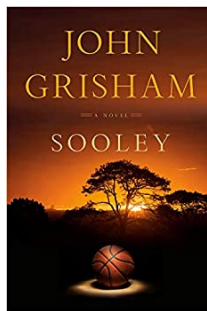
Four famous siblings throw an epic end-of-summer party that goes dangerously out of control as secrets and loves that shaped this family's generations come to light, changing their lives forever.

by Miranda Cowley Heller

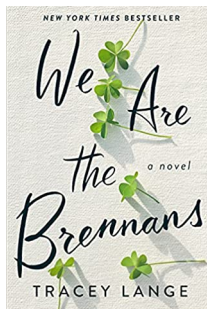
While staying at "The Paper Palace" — 50-year-old Elle must decide between the life she has built with her husband and the life she always imagined she would have had with her childhood love.

by John Grisham

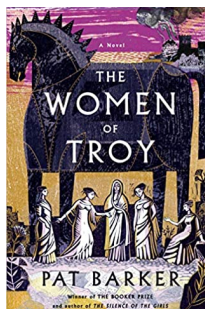

by Tracey Lange

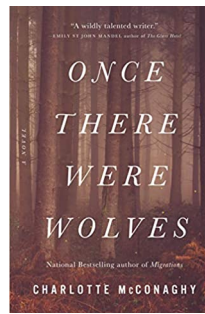

by Pat Barker

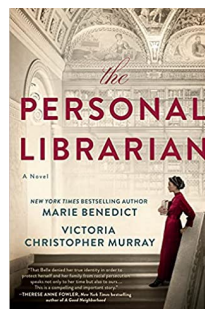

by Francine Prose

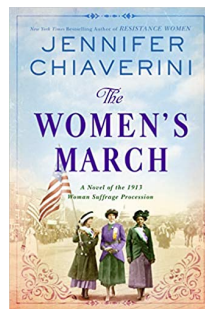
