BEST ROMANCE


Book Lovers by Emily Henry

by Nita Prose



Sea of Tranquility by Emily St. John Mandel



Atlas of the Heart by Brené Brown


In Atlas of the Heart, Brown takes us on a journey through eighty-seven of the emotions and experiences that define what it means to be human.

I'm Glad My Mom Died



Bad Gays: A Homosexual History by Huw Lemmey & Ben Miller



BEST GRAPHIC NOVEL & COMIC


Heartstopper: Volume Four by Alice Oseman
