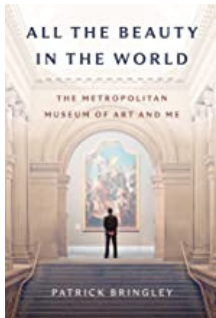


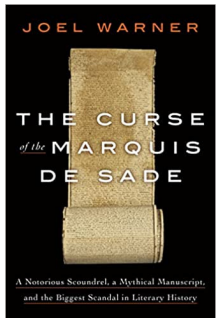

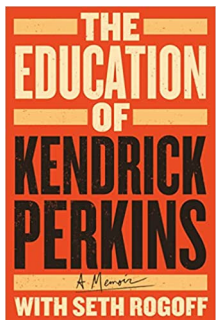
**All the Beauty in the World: The Metropolitan Museum of Art and Me**

A fascinating, revelatory portrait of the Metropolitan Museum of Art and its treasures by a former New Yorker staffer who spent a decade as a museum guard.



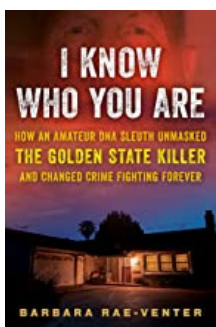
**The Curse of the Marquis de Sade: A Notorious Scoundrel, a Mythical Manuscript, and the Biggest Scandal in Literary History**

The captivating, true story of how one of the most notorious novels—Marquis de Sade's 120 Days of Sodom—became one of the biggest scams in modern literary history.



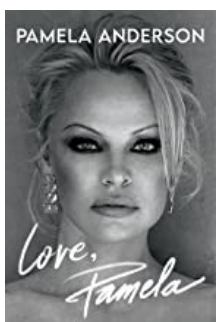
**The Education of Kendrick Perkins: A Memoir**

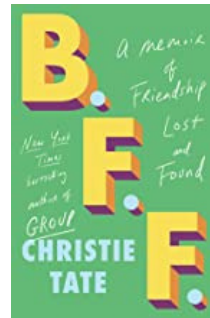

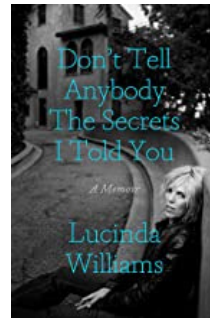
**Love, Pamela: A Memoir of Prose, Poetry, and Truth**

A moving, heartwarming, and powerful memoir about Christie Tate's lifelong struggle to sustain female friendship, and the friend who helps her find the human connection she seeks.



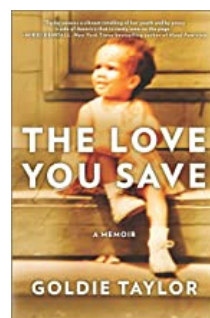

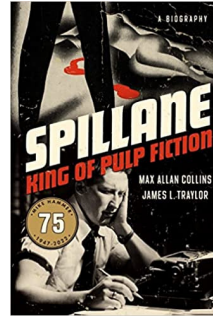
**Pageboy: A Memoir**

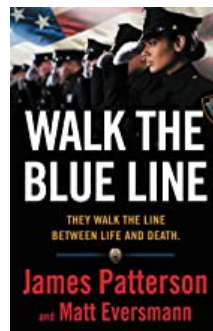
**Sink: A Memoir**
