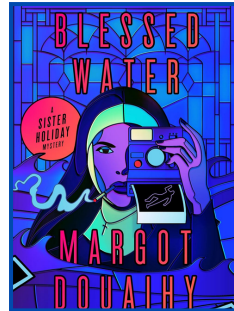


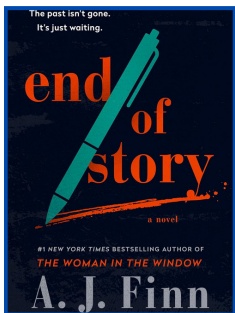
Annie Bot

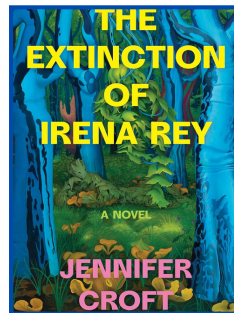
Blessed Water

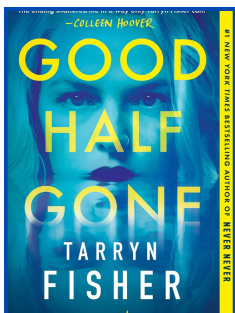
End of Story

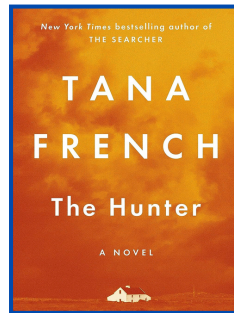
The Extinction of Irena Rey

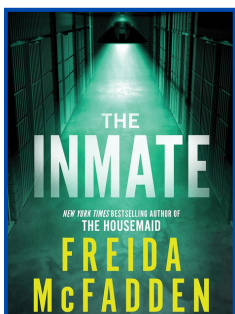
Good Half Gone

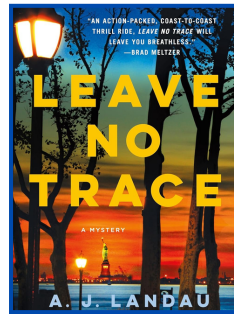
The Hunter

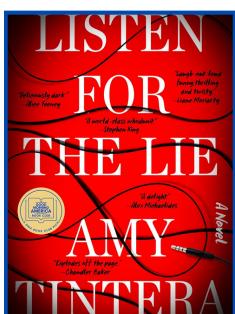
The Inmate

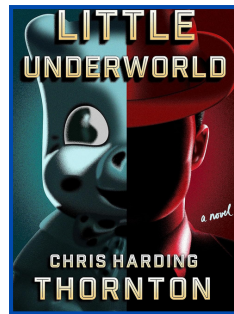
Leave No Trace

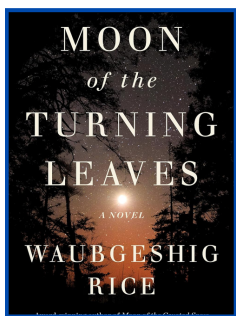
Listen for the Lie

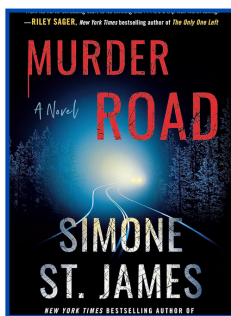

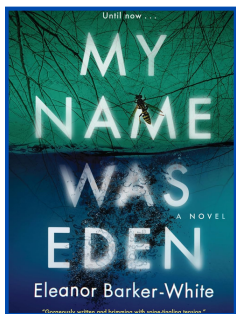

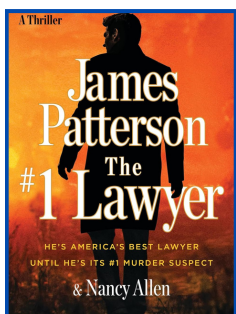
Murder Road

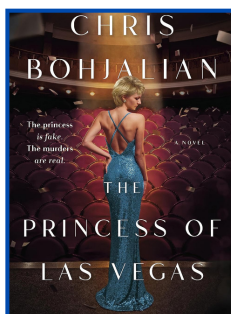
My Name Was Eden

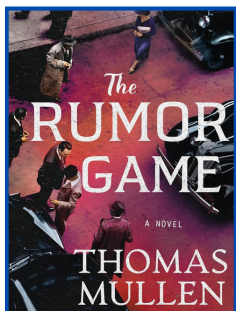
The New Couple in 5b

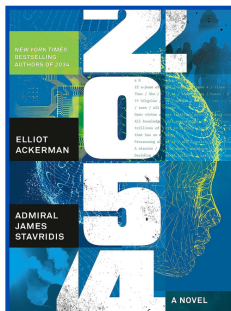
The #1 Lawyer

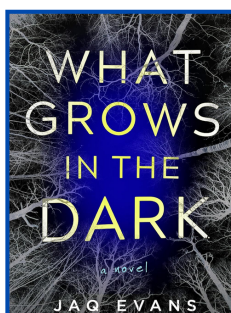
The Rumor Game
