Newberg Area Habitat for Humanity is an ecumenical housing ministry that works in conjunction with Habitat for Humanity International to build homes with those in need. A volunteer-driven organization, Newberg Area Habitat for Humanity cultivates goodwill and directs it to the problem of affordable housing. Through donated time, money, materials, professional services and the efforts of the to-be-homeowners themselves, homes are built and sold to needy families in our community. Volunteer labor, in-kind donations and no interest mortgages keep the homes affordable.
